Monday, June 15, 2020

Beresford City Council met in regular session in City Council Chambers on June 15, 2020 at 7:00 p.m.

Members Present: Mayor Nathan Anderson presiding, Troy Boone, Steve Cain, Gerald Dahlin, Art Schott and Teresa Sveeggen.

Members Absent: Troy Doeden

Also Present: Elaine Johnson, Finance Officer; Jerry Zeimetz, City Administrator; and Tom Frieberg, City Attorney.

Adopt Agenda: Cain made a motion to adopt the agenda as amended. The motion was seconded by Dahlin and all present Council members voted aye; motion carried.

Minutes: A motion to approve the meeting minutes from June 1, 2020 was made by Sveeggen and seconded by Boone. All present Council members voted aye; motion carried. A motion to approve the June 3, 2020 special meeting minutes was made by Dahlin and seconded by Boone. All present Council members voted aye; motion carried.

Visitors to be Heard: Joanne Paulsen, representing the Beresford Chamber of Commerce, was present to update Council on the events planned for the Old-Fashioned Weekend to be held July 31-August 2.

Department Head and City Administrator Reports

- Elaine Johnson – Finance Officer: Johnson gave a brief overview of May financials. A motion to accept the May financials was made by Dahlin and seconded by Sveeggen. All present Council members voted aye; motion carried.
- Jerry Zeimetz – City Administrator:
 - **Sales Tax Revenue:** A report on sales tax revenue was shared and discussed.
 - **Transmission Line/Substation Bonds:** Bonds in the amount of \$6,755,000 for the East Substation Project will be issued this week.
 - **Lewis and Clark Regional Water System:** Information about possible limitation on the cities full reserved capacity was discussed. It is not anticipated that Beresford will go over capacity but we will continue to monitor water consumption.
 - **LED Lamp Giveaway Opportunity:** Missouri River Energy is offering members an opportunity to purchase Bright Energy Solutions LED lamps as a giveaway for customers. The cost of the lamps will be reimbursed to the City. Zeimetz will visit with local organizations about distribution of the bulbs.

Executive Session–Personnel and Legal: A motion was made by Sveeggen to enter into executive session at 7:17 p.m. to discuss personnel and legal matters. The motion was seconded by Dahlin and all present Council members voted aye; motion carried.

Mayor Anderson declared Council out of executive session at 7:54 p.m.

New Business:

- **Golf Course and Parks Supt. Position:** A motion was made by Dahlin and seconded by Schott to promote Greg Bates to Golf Course and Parks Superintendent with a salary of \$53,000/year effective June 15, 2020. All present Council members voted aye; motion carried.
- **Golf Course, Parks and Public Works Position:** Discussion was held on the job description for a full-time Golf Course, Parks and Public Works position. A motion authorizing advertisement for a

Golf Course, Parks and Public Works full-time employee was made by Sveeggen and seconded by Cain. All present Council members voted aye; motion carried.

- **Swimming Pool Hire:** A motion to hire Kelly Knutson as a part-time swimming pool employee at \$15.00/hr. on an “as needed” basis was made by Schott and seconded by Sveeggen. All present Council members voted aye; motion carried.
- **2019 Audit:** A motion was made by Dahlin to accept the 2019 Audit Report as presented by Quam, Berglin and Post. The motion was seconded by Boone and all present Council members voted aye; motion carried.
- **Review bids:** After a review of bids received, a motion to accept the low bid from IES Commercial, Inc. for the 115kV Transmission Line Construction Project in the amount of \$920,999.00 was made by Dahlin and seconded by Schott. All present Council members voted aye; motion carried. All other bids are on file at City Hall.
- **Step Pay Increase:** A motion was made by Schott and seconded by Sveeggen to approve Police Officer Austin Van Horn’s step pay increase from \$20.64/hr. to \$21.19/hr., effective June 10, 2020. All present Council members voted aye; motion carried.

- **Lewis and Clark Regional Water Annual Meeting:** The annual meeting will be held via Zoom at 1:00 p.m. on June 25, 2020. Tom Erickson is the delegate for Beresford and Nathan Anderson is the alternate.
- **July 4 Fireworks:** It was confirmed that there will be a fireworks display at Cortland Carnes Field on July 4. Finance Officer Johnson will meet with Supt. Brian Field to discuss areas the public can access for viewing the display.
- **July 6 Meeting:** A motion to move the regular City Council meeting from July 6 to July 7 (7:00 p.m.) was made by Schott and seconded by Sveeggen. All present Council members voted aye; motion carried.
- **Gun Club:** The Parks Committee will meet with the Gun Club President to address changes in Gun Club hours, signage and enforcement as previously discussed.
