

BERESFORD CITY COUNCIL

Monday, March 21, 2022

The Beresford City Council met in regular session in City Council Chambers at 7:00 p.m.

Members Present: Mayor Nathan Anderson presiding, Troy Boone, Troy Doeden, Will Roelke, Art Schott, Teresa Sveeggen, Mike Tiedeman

Also Present: Elaine Johnson, Finance Officer; Jerry Zeimetz, City Administrator; Tom Frieberg, City Attorney.

Adopt Agenda: A motion to adopt the agenda as presented was made by Doeden and seconded by Boone. All present Council members voted aye; motion carried.

Approve Minutes: A motion to approve the March 7, 2021 meeting minutes was made by Boone and seconded by Doeden. All present Council members voted aye; motion carried.

Public Hearings

Local Board of Equalization: Council recessed at 7:01 p.m. to meet as the 2022 Board of Equalization. There was one appeal for Union County and one appeal and for Lincoln County. At 7:34 p.m. Council reconvened in regular session.

Department Head and City Administrator Reports

- **Mike Antonson, Electric Dept. Supt:** Antonson informed Council that the light poles at the Teener-Legion baseball field are at least 40 years old and not in good condition. As the lights are being replaced in the near future, he asked Council to consider replacing the poles as well. Information on new poles was distributed and discussed. A motion to approve the purchase of new poles from WESCO for \$59,649 was made by Doeden and seconded by Schott. All present Council members voted aye; motion carried.
- **Elaine Johnson, Finance Officer:** Johnson highlighted some of the receipts and expenditures from the February 2022 financials. After brief discussion, Schott made a motion to accept the February 2022 financial reports. The motion was seconded by Tiedeman and all present Council members voted aye; motion carried.
- **Jerry Zeimetz, City Administrator:** Zeimetz informed Council that Michael's Fence has begun work on the dog park.

Old Business: Zeimetz gave an overview of the options received from Girard Auction in regard to the sale of the Liquor Store building and inventory. It was decided to hold the auction on-line; Zeimetz will work with Girard to set the date and the final list of items to be sold on the auction will be available at the next meeting.

New Business
